ID-AYU0356) in respect of your application/scheme vide ref. no. 169/SBSJSAMC& H/PG/2022 dated 30.10.2022 to start 03 new PG courses with 18 seats in the subjects namely (i) Shalya Tantra-06 seats , (ii) Prasuti Evum Stri Rog-06 seats and (iii) Kaumarabhritya Bala Roga- 06 seats and denial of Letter of Intent (LoI) to start a new PG course in the subject Kayachikitsa-06 seats under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2023-24- reg.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made there under shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made there under. Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM ACT 2020 shall not be applicable.

I am to refer to your application vide ref. no. 169/S.B.S.J.S.A.M.C.&H./P.G./2022 dated 30.10.2022 for seeking permission of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, National Commission for Indian System of Medicine, New Delhi to start 04 new PG courses with 24 seats in the subjects namely (i) Shalya Tantra- 06 seats, (ii) Prasuti Evum Stri Rog- 06 seats, (iii) Kaumarabhritya Bala Roga- 06 seats & (iv) Kayachikitsa- 06 seats under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2023-24 at Shri Babu Singh Jay Singh Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital Bhaupur, Bewar Road, Fatehgarh, Dist. Farrukhabad -209602, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID-AYU0356) and to verify the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff and other facilities available at your college for issuance of Letter of Intent (LoI), the visitation was conducted on 22.06.2023 & 23.06.2023 through hybrid mode by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board (NCISM).

1. As per the direction of the **President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM)**, all the relevant documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely "the **Establishment of New Medical College, Opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training and Increase of Admission Capacity by a Medical College Regulations, 2019**, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Post-graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under, and visitor's observation report.
2. Further, the assessment report was placed in the **53rd Board Meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **16.08.2023**. On careful examination of the assessment report, **Board decided to issue the Letter of Intent (LOI) to start 03 new PG courses with 18 seats in the subjects namely (i) Shalya Tantra-06 seats, (ii) Prasuti Evum Stri Rog-06 seats and (iii) Kaumarabhritya Bala Roga- 06 seats after seeking clarification for non availability of an animal house and central research laboratory; and denial of Letter of Intent (LoI) to start new PG course in the subject of Kayachikitsa-06 seats as your college has submitted an affidavit mentioning that you are not able to proceed with PG in Kayachikitsa as the recruitment was not being done for the concerned teaching department ; under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2023-24.**

3. Therefore, you were provided an opportunity to submit your clarification regarding the non-availability of animal house and central research laboratory vide letter of even number dated 22.08.2023 and in response the Board has received your clarification letter vide ref no.S.B.S.J.S.A.M.C.& H./138/2023 dated 27.08.2023.
4. Further, **Letter of Intent (LOI) is issued to Shri Babu Singh Jay Singh Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital Bhaupur, Bewar Road, Fatehgarh, Dist. Farrukhabad -209602, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID-AYU0356) to start 03 new PG courses with 18 seats in the subjects namely (i) Shalya Tantra-06 seats , (ii) Prasuti Evum Stri Rog-06 seats and (iii) Kaumarabhritya Bala Roga- 06 seats denial of Letter of Intent (LoI) to start a new PG course in the subject of Kayachikitsa-06 seats from the academic session 2023-24 under section 29 of NCISM ACT 2020** and relevant regulations thereunder, subject to the condition that following conditions shall be fulfilled before issuance of Letter of permission (LOP) for the academic session 2023-24, failing which the Letter of Permission (LOP) shall not be issued and Letter of Intent (LOI) issued shall be deemed to be withdrawn.
 - i. The applicant shall fulfill all the requirements of infrastructure for teaching and training facilities as specified in "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016";
 - ii. The applicant shall fulfill all the relevant provisions of Regulations namely the "Establishment of New Medical College, Opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training and increase of Admission Capacity by a Medical College Regulations, 2019"
 - iii. The applicant shall fulfill all the requirements of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016";
 - iv. The applicant shall fulfill all the requirements of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Post-graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016" for grant of permission to start PG course;
 - v. The applicant shall fulfill all the relevant provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020.
5. The applicant is also required to submit the requisite fixed security deposit as specified **under the section 6 (2) (j) (i)** of notified Regulations namely the "Establishment of New Medical College, Opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training and Increase of Admission Capacity by a Medical College Regulations, 2019" on demand before issuance of Letter of Permission (LOP).
6. The college administration is to ensure that no student is admitted in the three new PG Courses i.e. (i) Shalyatantra, (ii) Prasuti Tantra & Stri Roga and (iii) Kaumarabhritya Bala Roga till the formal permission i.e. Letter of Permission (LOP) is granted.
7. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) will visit the college virtually, physically or Hybrid mode to verify the compliance/ fulfillment of the above conditions by the applicant and issuing/not issuing the LOP will be considered.
8. In the event, the applicant college fails to comply with or satisfy the conditions of the Letter of Intent; the Letter of Intent shall be deemed to have been withdrawn without further intimation to the applicant.
